The Trbovlje Coal Mines Ltd. (Trifail) were founded in 1873 with a capital of 1,500,000 Florins, the capital was increased later as follows:

The capital is divided into 1 million shares of 50 Dinars each.

The first mines which became the property of the company were the old mines "Vode" and the mines called "Pancrace" (formerly Maurer) in the valley of the Trboveljščica, not far from the station Trbovlje. In 1880 the company acquired the mines of "Zagorje" and "Hrastnik", in 1884 those of "Liboje" near Celje (Cilli) and in 1885 the mines of "Kočevje" (Gottschee) were bought. With a view of rounding off
