There were also received during the year obligations of the United States in the par amount of $\$ 165,260,000$ in payment of amounts due from foreign governments under funded debt agreements, of which $\$ 29,000,000$ was on account of principal and $\$ 136,260,000$ was on account of interest. These obligations have been canceled and retired and the public debt reduced accordingly.

An identical report is being submitted to the President of the Senate.
