BANK CREDIT, MONEY RATES, AND BUSINESS ACTIVITY

The set of 24 charts presented in this book comprises the principal graphic material currently prepared by the Division of Research and Statistics and presented to the Federal Reserve Board. The data relating to the Federal reserve banks and the member banks of the Federal reserve system are derived from regular reports made to the Federal Reserve Board; figures for gold movements, money in circulation, and money rates are obtained largely from other sources; index numbers on production and employment are compiled by the Federal Reserve Board on the basis of material collected by other agencies; and trade statistics are both collected and compiled by the Federal reserve system.

Figures underlying the charts are all published currently in the Federal Reserve Bulletin and in the Annual Reports of the Federal Reserve Board. Most of the figures are made available to the public also through statements issued to the press by the Federal Reserve Board—weekly on the banking data and monthly on the index numbers.
