Onions

Onions are shipped from many states. The shipping season for the majority of the states lasts nine to ten months. California and New York, however, make shipments in every month of the year, the former shipping most heavily in May and the latter in October, while Virginia on the contrary ships only during June, July and August. The majority of states make no shipments in May and June. Total shipments in May, however, are fairly large owing to the heavy movement from California and Texas. June is the lightest month of the year. The peak shipments are made in October, with a considerable movement also in September. During these two months about 29 per cent of total shipments are made. From December through May, the monthly shipments are fairly well balanced.

The annual movement of onions during the three years amounted to 32,215 carloads. New York State originated 4,970 cars; Texas, 4,392 cars; Indiana, 4,064 cars; California, 3,322 cars; Massachusetts, 3,018 cars; Ohio, 2,963 cars; Michigan, 1,713 cars; Colorado, 1,474 cars; Iowa, 1,315 cars, and Washington, 1,073 cars. These ten states combined accounted for over 87 per cent of the average annual movement.

Peppers

Three states, Florida, New Jersey and Louisiana, furnish the greater part of the pepper shipments. Of the 2,320 cars constituting the average annual movement of the three years, these three states furnished 2,110 cars, or about 91 per cent. Florida contributed 982 cars; New Jersey, 815 cars, and Louisiana, 313 cars.



In Florida the shipping season for peppers begins in October, increases through December, declines through March, then increases rapidly to a peak in June, and closes in July. In Louisiana, shipments begin in June with a fairly heavy movement, increase slightly in July and then drop to a few cars in August, when shipments practically cease. In New Jersey shipments start in July, increase rapidly to a peak in September, then subside gradually in October and rapidly in November, after which no more shipments take place.

For the United States, the trend of shipments have a wavelike movement with two crests, one in June and the other in October. Owing to differences in shipping season in the different states, some pepper shipments are made every month.
