

plying water power as their motive force. There are also a few factories which prepare fish oil, herring-guano and fish meal for export, and a number of machine shops along the coasts. Of other factories may here be mentioned those engaged in the manufacture of margarine, soap, non-alcoholic beverages and sweets for the homemarket.

Reykjavík has a slipway chiefly intended for repairs and the building of small vessels; and a gas-works and a power-plant supplying gas and electricity.

In various parts of the country electrical plants have been erected, most of them employing water power as their motive force.
