

REPLY OF THE GREEK MINISTER TO THE CHANCELLOR OF THE
EXCHEQUER.

SIR,

I have the honour to acknowledge receipt of the letter under the same date, by which you have been so good as to inform me that on the occasion of the signature of the Agreement for the funding of the Greek War Debt to Great Britain, you desire to emphasise to me the friendly attention with which His Britannic Majesty's Government are following the efforts of my Government to restore the financial situation of Greece and to stabilise Greek currency. Furthermore you express the conviction that the settlement of the Greek War Debt to Great Britain will contribute to this end, and you kindly assure me that His Britannic Majesty's Government would view with the utmost sympathy any well considered plan of financial reconstruction framed on adequate lines, and will gladly give such a plan the fullest support that may be in their power. You also state that His Britannic Majesty's Government are the more ready to give this support in view of and in return for the waiver by my Government, as part of the Debt funding Agreement, of their claim to the balance of the credits arising from the agreement of 10th February, 1918.

I wish, in expressing to you my sincere thanks for the above assurances given in the name of His Britannic Majesty's Government, to take account of the contents of your letter on behalf of my Government.
