SIR: Herewith are transmitted a series of tables, Nos. 1 to 19, exhibiting the amount of American and foreign tonnage employed in foreign trade in the districts of Portland, Boston, New York, Philadelphia, Baltimore, Mobile, and New Orleans, annually, from 1826 to 1851; the foreign tonnage engaged in the same trade, from 1821 to 1851, inclusive; the tonnage employed in the trade with Canada, from 1833 to 1851; and, also, the tonnage employed in foreign trade, from 1815 to 1820; prepared in obedience to a resolution of the Senate of the United States of the 7th of January, 1852.
